## Editorial

*One of the most important goals aimed by Romanian Journal Policy is to support the young researchers as their work to become known worldwide. Therefore, this issue consists of three papers authored by doctoral students enrolled at one of the most prestigious Economics universities from Romania. Work-in-progress versions of these articles were presented at The Annual Doctoral Conference organized in September 2011 by Bucharest Academy of Economic Studies and West University of Timișoara. This academic event was co-financed from the European Social Fund through Sectoral Operational Programme Human Resources Development 2007-2013, project number POSDRU/107/1.5/S/77213,, Ph.D. for a career in interdisciplinary economic research at the European standards". After a careful consideration of all of the drafts presented at the conference RJFP selected only three studies which define mostly the aim and scope of our journal. The review process took at least six months while our referees suggested the authors to improve their work to meet all the requirements of a quality academic writing. The papers focus on the recent financial crisis and on its global effects, but even if the authors share the same research interests, we can observe three different views on the same issue.*
